- A huge % of dysfunctional municipalities, many of whom are dependent on Govt bailouts,
- Ineffective, lethargic Municipal Councils, a number of whom are governed by political parties, in some cases ineffective coalition Govt's, who's only interests are the control of resources and governance at the expense of the citizenry,
- The decline of Govt services in all Govt dept's,
- Unacceptable levels of unemployment,
- High food prices which affects ordinary citizens and the poor harshly. In this regard, the State is MUTED on how to mitigate the duress and ameliorate these challenges which are having a serious and negative impact on the it's citizens,
- A Weak currency which continues to contribute to higher prices for imported goods such as:
 - specialized goods and equipment;

- poor administrative municipal services, billing as an example,
- ineffective refuse removal services,
- unkempt parks and recreational facilities,
- poor upkeep of cemeteries,
- street lights not working,
- streets and sidewalks that are filthy,
- overall, poor municipal pool infrastructure,
- municipal inability to enforce by laws,
- Overcrowded prisons,
- A public health, social welfare , Policing and education system in decline,
- A justice system that is expensive and favours the wealthy, coupled with long delays before cases are heard,
- A weak intelligence system (this is observed by the recent riots and looting),
- A weak prosecutorial system,
- Porous borders,
- High levels of crime, had it not been for private security companies, SA would be a place like Mexico & , Somalia, to name a few,
- Govt mortuaries that are on the brink of dysfunctionality, it is so bad,
